The Gradient tool allows you to paint a visual transition from one image to another. It is also called a color manager tool. The Healing Brush is similar to the Clone Stamp in that it is used to repair parts of an image. The difference is that it uses the content of adjacent pixels to determine the best blend. The Lasso tool is a simple and fast way to select an area by tracing it with your mouse. The Magic Wand helps to select an area of pixels in an image. It is often used to select an image or layer for cropping. The Pen tool is similar to a regular pen, although it allows for more precise pixel selection and drawing than regular brushes. The Scissors tool is similar to a regular pen, however it allows for precision cuts within an image.

How to Work with the Type Tool in Photoshop

Once you are familiar with the main features of Photoshop, you'll want to know how to work with the Type tool. To begin with, you'll want to understand the basics of using the Type tool. Press and hold the T key, and click on a font, a type style, or something else of interest. Your display will show the type tool on the screen. You can enter text by typing, typing with the keyboard, or clicking on a typeface that you select with the Type tool. You can select type at any point within the graphics context (window or drawing area). To do this, click on a type, part of a type, or type style. The Type tool will highlight itself and change to a solid color. While the Type tool is selected, you can select one or more type options by pressing the letter at the beginning of the option. For example, if you have selected Baseline, you can press B to select Baseline text, or H to select heading type. Once you've made your selection, you can click on the space inside the type line to move it to a new location. When you're done making your type selection, click on the space beside the type to terminate it. You can also change the type settings by clicking on the Options button beside the Type tool. You can change these settings by clicking on the Type tool itself. Although you could use the Type tool to select type, you should remember that the Type tool can also be used as a regular pen. The Avengers are back! Of course, the event that reunites the six heroes of Marvel's blockbuster Avengers franchise is with screens this weekend, but there's also a whole string of new comics called "Earth's Mightiest Heroes." The first volume of the series aims to answer the question, "Who is Iron Man?" - and the answer, it would seem, is Tony Stark. In the wake of his personal tragedy in the Hulk movie last summer, it's time to "return him to his rightful place." On the cover of Iron Man #1, we see Iron Man in his singular helmet, flanked by Captain America and Thor and looking to the readers with that familiar "I am Iron Man" stare. Even with that iconic image, Joe Quesada's script is not exactly adequate to the character. Tony Stark needs some body language, as well as a few more lines of dialogue, and the transition between the Hulk movie and the new film Iron Man 2 introduces a new set of problems. Who is Tony Stark? The word "iron" refers to the element iron in a superheated state, something the metallic character here is obviously wearing. As a character, the most instantly recognizable Iron Man aspect is his armor - or more specifically, his arc reactor. Indeed, the Iron Man's helmet creates a new world for his arc reactor to power his unique suit of armor, and he uses the hammer as a symbol for the power of his armor. And indeed, Tony Stark's armor is arguably the most "Avengers-y" of the Avengers - I mean, it's called "Iron Man," after all. As such, Tony Stark really is the Avengers' Iron Man. But it's not just the armor, either; Tony Stark's knowledge and experience with armor combined with his personality (being at once a nerd and a playboy) combine for a character that has proven himself to be a powerful asset to the team. He leads them, and they follow his orders, and he even knows how to lead the team. And so it's a bit odd when Tony Stark, as written in this first volume, is shown to be quite different from how readers remember him.
